SYMBOLS, LETTERS and NUMBERS

- * This species needs special care which is described on the reverse side.
- ? We have no information on this species. We sometimes provide an informed guess about which approach you should try. Let us know what is successful.
- ! Sow immediately. Either the viability of these seeds is short or the species propagates best with fresh seed. Stored seed might be coaxed into germination with temperature cycling and patience.
- [X] This seed is restricted and cannot be imported to the United States.
- [i] This plant is considered invasive in Ontario. Propagate with caution.

- A Sow @ 20°C. Seed germinates within 3 months.
- B Sow @ 20°C. If seed does not germinate within 3 months, try 4°C for 1-2 months, then 20°C again.
- C Sow @ 20°C for 3 months, then place @ 4°C for 3 months.
- D Use repeated cycles of 20°C, then 4°C for 3 months each. Germination is very prolonged.
- E Sow @ 20°C for 6 weeks, then place @ 4°C for 6 weeks, then slowly raise temperature to 10°C for 6 weeks. If there is no germination, repeat the cycle.
- F Sow @ 4°C.
- G Sow @ 4°C for 3 months, then place @ 20°C for 3 months.
- H Use repeated cycles of 4°C, then 20°C for 3 months each. Germination is very prolonged.
- J Sow @ 4°C for 3 weeks, then place @ 20°C.
- K Sow @ 10°C.
- L Expose to fluctuating outdoor winter temperatures including freezing for 3 months. Gradually increase light and temperature in spring.
- N Sow directly in garden.

- 1 Resents transplanting.
- 2 Requires darkness.
- 3 Requires light or the seed is very fine. Surface sow and expose to light.
- 4 Germination is improved by using GA3.
- 5 Germination is successful only when GA3* is used.
- 6 Requires scarification. Nick or rub between sheets of sandpaper.
- 7 Requires soaking. Place in warm water until seeds swell, usually 24-48 hours. Discard water and any seeds that remain floating.
- 8 Pulpy coat inhibits germination. Remove by soaking and rinsing in clean water for approximately 7 days. Discard water.
- 9 At one time, we advised "Tails may inhibit germination. Remove them." The advice applied primarily to pulsatillas and clematises. Our most recent data indicates that leaving the tails on has no effect on germination.

WHAT OUR TEMPERATURE DESIGNATIONS MEAN

- 4°C Either place seeds outdoors to be exposed to a wide range of winter temperatures including freezing or put them in a refrigerator (not a deep freezer).
- 10°C Either place seeds outdoors in spring or fall or choose a very cool indoor location.
- 20°C Either place seeds in a sheltered outdoor location in mid to late spring or grow at room temperature.

Acer pseudosieboldianum: soak 3 weeks to remove outer seed coat, then slice off small portion of inner coat

Aconitum: seed very poisonous, wash hands after handling, 20°C x 4 weeks, then -7°C x 6 weeks, then 10°C

Actaea pachypoda: seedlings must be grown at less than 20°C and can overwinter at -20°C, prick out while small

Actaea dahurica and Rosa: scarify with concentrated sulphuric acid for at least 3 hours CAUTION: THIS CAN BE A DANGEROUS PROCEDURE

Agapanthus: constant humidity, very slow germination

Allium suworowii: requires long cold period - more than 45 days

Allium stipitatum: scarify one year old seeds with sulfuric acid for 15 min, and stratify at 4°C.

Anemonopsis macrophylla: if allowed to dry for even 3 weeks, will need 18 months to germinate

Asclepias: plant in deep pot or in situ to avoid damaging long taproot; seed viability < 1 year; **A. tuberosa** warm cycle should be hot (30-37°C)

Baptisia: fresh seed does not require soaking, but stored seed should be soaked in boiling water until it cools

Berberis, Cornus, Magnolia, and Phytolacca: wash and rinse daily in clean water x 14 days to remove pulp, store dry

Calibanus hookeri: improved seed-germination after removal of pericarp and testa

Calla and Caltha: stand pot in 3 cm water; raise temperature very slowly after germination

Helleborus: dry storage impairs germination

Caragana pygmaea: scarify seed that hasn't swollen after soaking 24 hours then resoak

Cardiocrinum: Seedlings are more vulnerable to frost than mature plants. Process can be speeded up but if timing is wrong it will germinate in fall and not survive winter

Caulophyllum, Jeffersonia, Maianthemum, Uvularia: dry seed will not germinate, sow fresh in spring

Cercis: scarify very gently or will rot

Cladrastis kentukea: scarify in hot tap water, leave to soak for 24 hours

Clematis recta and Primula sieboldii: dry storage for > 6 months is fatal

Clematis serratifolia: remove as much of outer seed coat as possible

Clematis texensis and 'Buckland Beauty': sow in acidic soil; seedling will die back quickly, but keep pot as it will recover

Cleome: needs oscillating temperatures

Cyrtanthus elatus: float the seeds until they sprout, then carefully plant just underneath the medium surface

Cypripedium acaule: very difficult; grow in moist compost to which has been added soil from parent plant to provide symbiotic fungi or sow outside in spring in acid duff

Daphne: soak in dish washing detergent then clean in running water 12-24 hours

Dodecatheon: leaves die back in July; keep seedlings growing as long as possible

Eranthis, Fritillaria, Puschkinia, Prospero, Scilla, Tulipa: seedlings must remain at 4°C for full 3 months, then gradually raise temp to 20°C (best achieved by sowing in open ground); **Fritillaria** and **Eranthis** - dry storage for > 6 months is fatal

Eriogonum jamesii: protect first winter

Erythronium japonicum: 25°C x 3 months, then 5°C, will not germinate @ 20°C or 15°C

Freesia: sow seed in January, may bloom in 6 - 18 months

Genista: soak in hot water

Gentiana: avoid pricking out individually, transplant seedlings in clumps

Geum triflorum: subject to damping off

Iris: if sown as "L", bring indoors once germinated to avoid temperature shock; transplant at 4 leaves

Kalimeris incisa 'Blue Star': grow on @ 10°C

Lilium canadense, michiganense, pensylvanicum: 4 months warm, then 4 months cold

Meconopsis cambrica: start in soilless peat-based mix; dry storage > 6 months is fatal, will germinate in second spring

Muhlenbergia: 10 – 15°C after germination

Ocimum tenuiflorum: germinate @ 25°C

Oxytropis and Thermopsis: tiny seed should be scarified with sandpaper, pot deeply; protect from damping off;

Ruellia: 4°C x 14 weeks (very important for best germination), then 20°C

Paeonia: 20°C x 3 months or longer until a 4 cm radicle appears, then 4°C x 3 months; leaf will appear while chilled or in next 20°C cycle; leaves of **tenuifolia** appear simultaneously with radicle

Polygonatum zanlanscianense: place in moist sand in shade x 1 year; sow as soon as radicle appears

Sarracenia and Saxifraga: keep all seed pots x 2 years

Trillium: germination is unlikely after storage >6 months. If seeds are received dry, try hydrating in damp paper towel @ 20°C for 1 week. Then treat as "D". Keep all pots for 2 years.
